#### Cheesy Potato Soup (Golden Potato Soup) Serves 6-8

3 cups potatoes, finely chopped (peeled) 1 teaspoon parsley flakes

1 cup water 1/2 teaspoon salt

1 cup chicken stock (water & a bouillon cube) dash of pepper

1/2 cup celery, sliced 2 tablespoons flour 1/4 cup onion, chopped 1-1/2 cups milk

1/2 cup carrots, sliced 1/2 pound Velveeta cheese, cubed

 In a large saucepan or stockpot over medium heat, combine potatoes, water, stock, celery, onions, carrots, parsley, salt and pepper.


 Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, covered for 1 hour, until vegetables are tender. Stirring occasionally.

In small bowl gradually add milk to the flour until well blended.

Add flour/milk mixture to the pot and cook until thickened,

about 15 minutes, stirring often.

· Add cheese and stir until melted, the soup will thicken even more.



That is the choice before us, every one of us. How are we going to live in this new year?

**Prayer:** Lord, thank You for this new year that lies before me. I choose You. I choose to depend on You, trust You, and accept from Your hand all that You would give me.
