

We would swim off the side, and during the heavy storms we hid in the hull. In the evening we cooked hot dogs and marshmallows on the deck, and of course, we slept on the deck every night. On a windy day we would raise a make-shift sail that would push us up all the way to the "Old Road."

Ah yes! The "Old Road" was the dividing point between the "Little Pond" –our territory and the "Big Pond." There was a small entrance between the two ponds. The old road was really a sandbar that separated the "Little Pond" from the "Big Pond"- a place we were told NOT TO GO- it was a pond too far.

A sign of "manhood" for a young man was his ability to swim the three mile lake without touching the sandbar. Everyone wanted bragging rights. My brother Dave and I swam the length of the lake. In order to swim the three miles you had to go into the "Big Pond." This was a real breakthrough for Dave and me. One day we took the life boat through the road entrance-into the "Big Pond. "WOW! New Life for the Iron Lady! She became a craft on the high seas. We lifted her sail. She reached into the wind. She soared across the waves. It was her destiny. She was finally where she belonged.

Many of the folks I know have "old roads." They have boundaries in their lives. I know a few folks who have stopped dreaming- "Big Pond" stuff. Some folks have lost hope- too much "Big Pond" for them. Some folks no longer look for the wind at their back.

"Speaking Up for Hungry People"

On May 19, Pentecost Sunday, we participated in Bread for the World's Offering of Letters, "A Place at the Table, " sending 96 letters to our members of Congress speaking up for funding federal nutrition programs that help



families feed their children and for poverty-focused development aid that helps families in the poorest countries.

Our letters were sent as Congress debated the Farm Bill which includes these programs. While we need to support the local food pantry and our area CROPWALK, federal nutrition programs give 23 times more food aid to families in America. Since our letters were sent, the Senate has passed a \$400 million annual cut to SNAP (food stamps) with the House passing a much larger cut. These will have to be reconciled. Go to the Bread for the World website, bread.org, to check the progress of the Farm Bill.

We also sent petitions with 35 names to Bread for the World which will go to President Obama encouraging him to work with Congress in setting a goal to end hunger in America and around the world. BFW is seeking 100,000 signatures to show the depth of support for ending hunger. In the church we need a fresh wind of the Spirit to encourage us and move us to act and speak for hungry people. We can counter the voices in society that so often blame, denigrate, or marginalize poor people. May God find us faithful in the task.

Bread for the World is a collective Christian voice urging our nation's decision makers to end hunger at home and abroad.

A Devotional......

Every Word Matters — by Marvin Williams

Read: Deuteronomy 4:1-10

You shall not add to the word which I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of the Lord your God. —<u>Deuteronomy 4:2</u>

Kim Peek was a savant (a person with extraordinary memory) who memorized all of Shakespeare's plays. During a performance of *Twelfth Night*, Peek noticed that the actor had skipped a word from one of the lines. Peek suddenly stood up and shouted, "Stop!" The actor apologized and said he didn't think anyone would mind. Peek replied, "Shakespeare would."

Words matter. But especially when they are the very words of God. Moses warned Israel, "You shall not add to the word which I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of the Lord your God" (Deut. 4:2). Moses often reminded Israel of God's mercy and faithfulness to them in the past. But he also stressed the importance of obedience to God's commands as they prepared to enter the Promised Land. He told them that obedience would result in blessings of life and a rich inheritance (vs.39-40). Every command and regulation mattered to God. The value His people placed on God's Word showed their view of Him.

Today, when we value God's Word, handle it with great care, and obey what it says, we give God the reverence He truly deserves.
