

### **NEW VISION FOR DFUMC**



The 'Discipleship Vision Statement' is rendered in three (3) forms, depending on how it is to be used and to whom it is to be interpreted: a full-prose version and two abbreviated, or 'outline' versions. The full-prose version follows:

We foresee a future of individuals, life partners, families and youth in our diverse community who will need a God-inspired Faith that will help them to live confidently and gratefully, and cope with the traumas, anguish, and uncertainties of their rapidly changing world. We envision a Dingmans Ferry United Methodist CHURCH FAMILY who will **reach out** with Christian compassion, certainty, and a sense of peace, and who will joyfully welcome, mutually embrace, and wholeheartedly support them **as our own**—in a spirit of Christ-like Faith, Hope and Love.

The abbreviated 'descriptive version' of the Vision Statement is divided into four Vision 'domain' names that each contain three Vision 'focal points':

#### Our CHALLENGE:

<u>Lending pastoral and congregational uplift</u> to those in our midst who are faced with **Traumas**, **Anguish** and **Uncertainties** in their lives.

#### Our PROMISE:

Vowing to meet our CHALLENGE through the <u>outward conveyance</u> of Christian **Compassion, Certainty,** and a **Sense of Peace** to others.

#### Our MANDATE:

<u>Carrying out actions</u> that will consistently help deliver our PROMISE, by **Welcoming**, **Embracing**, and **Supporting** new individuals, life partners, and families to our circle of fellowship.

#### Our Christ-filled MEANS:

Seeking God's wisdom, guidance, and support to make our MANDATE a reality, through the <u>ongoing practice</u> of **Faith**, **Hope**, and **Love** for others in our midst.

The third abbreviated version of the Vision Statement simply lists the four Vision domain names and twelve Vision focal points for visual emphasis.

Equally as important as the Vision Statement itself is an accompanying folder that provides background and support information, and interprets the meaning and purpose of various aspects of the Vision Statement. Four copies of this interpretive Vision folder will be available in the church office for congregational members and leaders who wish to reference it in the context of some aspect of future church programming. Users are simply asked to sign out the folder and return it to the office in a timely manner.

The Visions Team wishes to stress that *visioning* is a vitally important mandate of any church that seeks to remain at the cutting edge of its ministries. The Dingmans Ferry UMC stands at the brink of some exciting potential for Christian outreach and growth during the next several years and is poised, perfectly, to meet many of the critical physical, social, emotional, and spiritual needs of the community it serves.! Perhaps our church can derive needed inspiration for this visioning challenge from the lyrics of the venerable Irish hymn, "Be Thou My Vision," by making a slight adaptation from the singular to the plural:

Be Thou our Vision, O Lord of our heart; Naught be all else to us, save that Thou art; Thou our best Thought, by day or by night, Waking or sleeping, Thy presence our light.



## Update on Clearances for Volunteers - Susan Ridyard, SPRC Chairperson

On June 10, 2015, Governor Wolf announced that the PA Clearances for Child Abuse and PA Criminal History Check will be FREE for volunteers starting **July 25, 2015**, and reduced to \$8 each for employees and contractors. Therefore, we have moved our deadline for clearances for DFUMC volunteers working with children to **September 1, 2015** so that our volunteers can get their PA clearance fees waived. The FBI Clearance must still be paid separately, but this is only required for volunteers who have not been a PA resident continually the last 10 years. The required date for DFUMC Staff to complete all three clearances is still **July 1, 2015**.

## A Devotional....

## **God Takes The Summer Off......**

#### Scripture Reading:

Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

~ Hebrews 10:23-25(NRSV)



At the beginning of my first summer as a pastor, Louise Vandergrift, the only senior adult in our tiny congregation in Tennessee brought me a little article that she had clipped out of a magazine decades before. I never forgot the point of the article, so years later I called "Mrs. Louise" and asked her to fax it to me. I share it today with the hope that it sticks in your heart and mind the same way that it has in mine over the past 17 years.

"We are sorry to inform you that God will not be available during the summer beginning June 1st. He feels He deserves some time off, so He has canceled His normal duties for the summer.

He has agreed to send the sun and rain occasionally when He happens to be in town, but so far as answering prayers for the needs of your family, please don't count on Him.

God has let church leaders know that they should not plan any outreach efforts or mission trips during the summer—or at least if they do, they will have to do it without Him because He plans to be gone a lot to see relatives, baseball games and the lake. God has expressed the opinion that we should find someone else to take His place.

Then we reminded Him of His promise, "Surely I will be with you always," but He said He didn't realize when He said it that it meant going two or three years without a break. He expressed His sincere regret and hopes that it will not cause anyone any inconvenience.

God may be contacted anytime after September 1st at which time He hopes to get back into the routine. "Please defer all requests until then," He requested.
