

#### Miller's Mumblings......



Jesus also felt the call from God. Unlike Mark, our Lord was aware that his earthly life would end on a cross in Jerusalem, but he called his followers and continued the path to proclaim the Kingdom of God.

In church on Easter morning, you heard about the celebration in Jerusalem, you affirmed the resurrection and rejoiced in the promise of new life; but did you remember the primary reason Jesus Christ came into the world was to re-engage us in our relationship to God. The proclamation of the KINGDOM OF GOD was primary in the chapters of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Check the gospels! Jesus was preaching to the world about the God's kingdom both present and future. It is all about us! 

#### "Feeding our Children"

The 2015 Bread for the World's Offering of Letters focuses on the variety of programs that serve as safety nets for the food and nutrition needs of our nation's children. Nearly 16 million children in the United States live in households that struggle to put food on the table. Food provided by nutrition programs like the School Lunch Program, the School Breakfast Program, and WIC, help children perform better in school and get sick less often.

Congress must renew child nutrition programs every five years, and they are up for reauthorization in 2015. Our letters to our members of Congress will urge them to preserve the funding and nutrition standards that have proven effective. In our own Delaware Valley School District, 28% of the children enrolled receive free meals and 3.75% receive reduced price meals. The children right around us need our voice to speak up for protecting and improving nutrition programs.

On Sunday, May 17th, we will have information and a litany focused on the Offering of Letters, and following worship we will have the opportunity to add our voice through our letters. As their constituents, please let our senators and representative know that nutrition for children is a priority. May God find us faithful in speaking and acting for hungry people.





#### Easter Egg and Candy Sales

Once again, we had successful sales of the homemade Easter Eggs and Easter Candy. To date, approximately \$3,400 in profits have been made and some eggs are still available. The proceeds from the Easter Egg sale go to the general church fund and helps us pay the bills!



DFUMC is sponsoring a Heartsaver Pediatric CPR & First Aid Course that will be open to our Tree of Life (TOL) Preschool teachers, volunteers, and also to community members as space permits. The course will be taught **Saturday**, **June 6 from 8:30am-5:00pm at the Delaware Township Volunteer Ambulance Corps**. This is a certified AHA course that meets regulatory requirements, with hands on practice, an optional written test, and an AHA completion card. The cost is \$65 per person and payment is due by **May 15, 2015** to reserve your space. Please contact Susan Boyd-Ridyard, SPRC Chairperson, (susanridyard@gmail.com) for the registration form to enroll in this course. Space is limited to 12 learners to ensure adequate practice time, so please register now!

#### SPRC Update: PA Background Checks Requirements

As part of the UMC Safe Sanctuary Policy, clearances (background checks) and training are required every 3 years for **all church staff and volunteers** who work with children.



In addition, recent new PA legislation Act 153 (December, 2014) has made this issue even more critical as clearances for *employees and volunteers* who have contact with children must be completed every 3 years and must be submitted through the state sponsored agencies for clearances. Clearances that expire prior to 2015 are not acceptable. The deadline for updated clearances is **July 1**, **2015**. The rules for mandatory reporting of suspected abuse have also changed and staff should be trained on the new procedures. More information may be found at <a href="http://keepkidssafe.pa.gov/">http://keepkidssafe.pa.gov/</a>.

<u>All Church and Preschool Staff Members</u> having responsibility or any contact with children must obtain the following *three PA clearances by July 1, 2015*. GNJUMC or other clearances are not acceptable.

- a) Report of criminal history from the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) \$10; https://epatch.state.pa.us/
- b) Child Abuse History Clearance from the Department of Human Services (Child Abuse) \$10; <a href="https://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis">www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis</a> and
- c) FBI Fingerprint based federal criminal history complete in person and submitted through 3M Cogent- \$27.50 <a href="https://www.pa.cogentid.com/index\_dpwNew.htm">https://www.pa.cogentid.com/index\_dpwNew.htm</a>

<u>Adult Volunteers</u> that are responsible for the welfare of a child or having direct contact with children will also need the following updated PA clearances by *July 1, 2015*. At DFUMC, this includes Sunday School Teachers, Vacation Bible School Teachers, Preschool Volunteers, Nursery Volunteers, Choir Directors, etc. In addition, volunteers must sign a waiver saying they are volunteers and are not paid for services. GNJUMC or other clearances are not acceptable. *Unpaid helpers who are under the age of 18, do not need clearances*.

- a) Report of criminal history from the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) \$10; https://epatch.state.pa.us/
- b) Child Abuse History Clearance from the Department of Human Services (Child Abuse) \$10; <a href="www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis">www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis</a> and also you may need the FBI Clearance (see below)
- c) If you have not been a PA resident continuously since 2005, you also need to have the FBI - Fingerprint based federal criminal history complete in person and submitted through 3M Cogent- \$27.50 - You need to make an appointment for this. <a href="https://www.pa.cogentid.com/index\_dpwNew.htm">https://www.pa.cogentid.com/index\_dpwNew.htm</a>

SPRC has discussed the requirements with the Ad Board and Finance Committee and has communicated the requirements and reimbursement steps to church staff and volunteers who work with children. The first two clearances are on online and can be paid for by credit card. Staff (and also volunteers who don't meet the 10 year PA residency requirement) must make an appointment to go in person for the FBI fingerprinting. Locations are in Shohola, Stroudsburg and Honesdale. Staff and volunteers will submit a copy of the approved clearances, the receipts and the Reimbursement form and these will be kept in the personnel or volunteer files.

#### Training for Mandated Reporting and Safe Sanctuary

In addition, there is training required for staff and volunteers who work with children:

#### Online Training: Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse: Mandated and Permissive Reporting in Pennsylvania Free Online Training.

#### 2. Safe Sanctuary Overview Training Session

These will be 30 minute training sessions scheduled May and June to review the DFUMC Safe Sanctuary Policy and discuss mandated and permissive reporting requirements. These training sessions will be held between church services and also at other scheduled times. Check the website and church bulletin for dates and times. Attendance will be recorded at each session. At the training session, you will receive a copy of the Safe Sanctuary Policy and sign the form agreeing to follow the policy. This form will also be part of your Personnel or Volunteer File, in addition to the Clearances and other related documents.

At first glance, these new requirements may seem to be overwhelming, but in light of recent child abuse scandals, we all need to do our part in protecting Pennsylvania's children from abuse and neglect. All PA schools, churches, community organizations that work with children (i.e., Boy Scouts, Girls Scouts, 4H, etc.) are also having to comply with the new PA regulations, so many of our volunteers may already have the required clearances and training completed.


## A Devotional....

#### I Just Can't Do It!

For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. It isn't about you, but about the God who deserves all the honor and glory. He is the One who should be acknowledged in the midst of "your" success.
