





#### THE STORY OF BABY BLESSINGS PANTRY

Almost two years ago, I was impacted by the response to one of our semiannual Clothing Giveaways. I saw a few hundred people flowing through our doors searching for help in the way of clothing for their families, especially their children.

As we packed up after the event; I saved some baby and children's clothing, in the event of an emergency. It didn't take long for an emergency to arise and a grandmother who had gotten unexpected custody contacted me asking for help. Soon after, another grandparent custody issue, and then a devastating local fire where the family fled in pajamas and lost everything they owned.

Apparently, our Clothing Giveaway had grown overnight into a new and expanded ministry. I was soon granted access to an unused closet at church, and Baby Blessings Pantry became an official ministry at DFUMC. Running totally on donations, we stocked clothing, diapers, wipes, baby items and equipment and sometimes baby food and formula.

Our Facebook page "BABY BLESSINGS PANTRY" connected us to people giving away outgrown clothes and things, and offered to help others in need. We also joined forces with Bushkill Baby Pantry, Safe Haven, Calling All Angels, and Tri-State Pregnancy to trade, redistribute and share our donations. And now, we are part of a network of organizations that work together to help parents provide necessities for their children.

We outgrew our allotted closet immediately, and I began collecting items at my house. My garage became my baby storeroom, often to my husband's dismay, as there was no room for the car. I am no longer surprised to come home and find bags of baby clothes and strollers and high chairs in my driveway as people drop off donations.

Thankfully, by the grace of God, our Baby Blessings Pantry took a giant step forward this summer with the expansion of the closet and the addition of a shed. Although at the moment, the closet is in the final construction stage, the shed is filling up. We have accumulated bassinets, bouncers, strollers and more! **Donations of diapers is always appreciated.** 

Unfortunately, sometimes the unexpected donations left at church have caused concern for some, and I ask for your patience and understanding. These are not just donations, but answers to someone's prayer...that may not as yet been prayed.

## A Devotional....

Read: Galatians 6:1-10



"Whatever a man sows, that he will also reap."—Galatians 6:7

One autumn afternoon I drove past a field where a farmer had parked some massive machinery by the side of the road. A yellow caution sign read: "Harvest in Progress." As I glanced over at the field, I knew instantly what the farmer had planted several months ago—tiny kernels of corn. I knew this because he was preparing to drive his harvesting equipment through acres of mature cornstalks.

While it may seem obvious that planting corn leads to harvesting corn, we sometimes deny the relationship between sowing and reaping in our spiritual lives. The apostle Paul wrote, "Do not be deceived . . . ; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap" (Gal. 6:7). Living to please our flesh yields corruption in the form of wanting what isn't ours, self-centeredness, and even substance abuse (5:19-21). Walking with the Spirit produces peace, kindness, and self-control (5:22-23). By God's grace, we can choose to "sow to the Spirit" and reap eternal life (6:8).

Suppose Jesus declared today "harvest day" in our lives, and He asked us to gather up the yield of our everyday choices over the past year. What would we have to show Him?

Things of the world often pull at my heart, But, Lord, help me see the end from the start; Open my eyes to where my life's going, What I will reap from all I've been sowing. —K. DeHaan

The seeds we sow today determine the kind of fruit we'll reap tomorrow.
